From the Minister

I don't know about you, but January always seems to be the slowest month. It contained five Sundays this year, making it feel as though an extra week had been added to it, but even without that, January seems to drag by. Perhaps it's something to do with the weather, perhaps it's the challenge of a new year. Because there's a part of each one of us which feels that, having safely concluded 2015, we really can't be bothered to do it all over again in 2016.

Yet "do it" we must, because life does not stand still; and if we don't engage with it, it will pass us by. And so we find ourselves confronted by the spiritual challenge of Lent, the 40 day period leading up to Easter.

If January crawls by like a snail, this year at least February accelerates like a Ferrari. That's because Easter Sunday falls really early this year (on 27 March in fact), which means that Ash Wednesday is as early as 10 February. So whilst we're still apparently picking bits of tinsel out of our hair after Christmas, we find ourselves starting this year's Lent Course. And I'm here to tell you about it.

Over the past few years at our church we have engaged with Lent as a whole church study experience, which has proved very popular with many people in our fellowship. So this year we are once again running a five week course for Housegroups with themed preaching on each of the Sundays, and I really hope that you will join us in this adventure. If you normally attend, lead or host a Housegroup, can I urge you to meet weekly during the period of the course, even if your group normally meets fortnightly. If this is impractical then do the weeks that you can - you can still be a part of the experience, but it's best to engage fully so that you don't miss anything.

If you don't currently attend a Housegroup, can I urge you to join one (or even start one!) for the Lent period. You may disband after Easter, or you may actually find that being together in a small group is such fun that you want to continue. This has certainly been my experience.

This year's course will be on the subject of "Personal Evangelism", which was requested by our fellowship. There will be five weekly study sessions as follows:

Session 1: What is evangelism, and why should I do it?

Session 2: Lifestyle evangelism



Session 3: Servant evangelism
Session 4: Friendship evangelism

Session 5: In the world but not of the world

All of the study notes will be supplied to Housegroup leaders either by email from Helen Maddaford, or by picking up a paper copy at church. It's not necessary for every individual to have a copy, as the course is based around guided discussion and Bible study. Material for Week 1 will be available from Ash Wednesday, 10 February, and subsequent weeks' material will be made available on a weekly basis as the course progresses. This is deliberate because I value your feedback and I like to adapt the material as we move through the course, so as to address any issues or spiritual direction that we seem to be taking. After all, it is the Holy Spirit who is actually leading us and shaping our learning, so we need to be flexible.

One final point: because Easter is so early this year, Ash Wednesday falls during the week prior to the school half term holiday. Some people go away in half term, and I too am leading a kids holiday club at Yealmpton that week. So the plan is for the Lent Course to begin in Housegroups a week later, during the week commencing Monday 22 February. The first of the themed Sunday messages will begin on the following Sunday, 28 February. This means that the final study week will be during Holy Week, and the final message at the morning service on Easter Sunday.

Evangelism is one of those topics that some people are very wary of. I have met many people who like to describe their relationship with Jesus as a "private, personal faith" - which, to be honest, I think sounds a bit of a cop out. The context in which people make this statement implies that it is an internal phenomenon, which we don't talk about with others or practise in company. And it is true that the Lord has reached out to each one of us individually with the offer of forgiveness and salvation. In His grace He has given us freedom, and this means that it is our personal decision to repent, and our personal resolve to follow Jesus. But nowhere in scripture, nor in the practise of Christianity over 2,000 years, do we find people living out their faith in isolation. Even those who withdrew from society and founded monastic communities still did so in fellowship with one another. Our faith is our personal treasured possession, yet it is something that we cannot help but share with others. If it's true that it is "no longer I that live, but Christ who lives in me" (Galatians 2:20), then in actual fact we won't be able to prevent ourselves from sharing our faith: in the things that we say and do, and the way we lead our life. Come with me and discover how amazing it is to live well for Jesus in 2016, emboldened and freed by His love.
