From the Minister



During February we mark Valentine's Day, an occasion to celebrate relationships, and also for some retailers to make a lot of money! Relationships of all kinds are vitally important and they all take working at — whether that be in a marriage, a parent/child bond, a friendship, or relationships within a church. One of the keys to a successful relationship is

good communication and the Bible gives us clear guidance on how we can ensure that discord is not allowed to fester amongst us.

I read in Word for Today a few weeks ago these helpful rules given to a congregation by a new pastor and they really resounded with me so I felt that it was good to share them with you all.

- If you have a problem with me, come and see me privately. I'll do the same for you.
- ▼ If someone else has a problem with me and comes to you, send them to me. I'll do the same for you.
- If someone won't come to me, say, 'Let's go and see him together.'
 I'll do the same.
- Be careful how you interpret me -l'd rather do that. It's too easy to misinterpret intentions. I'll also be careful how I interpret you.
- ▼ If it's confidential, don't tell. If you, or anyone else comes to me in confidence, I won't tell, unless they are going to harm themselves, harm someone else, or a child or vulnerable adult has been physically or sexually abused. I expect the same from you.
- ♥ I don't read unsigned letters.
- ▼ I don't manipulate. I won't be manipulated. Don't let others manipulate you. And don't let others try to manipulate me through you.
- ♥ When in doubt, just say so. If I can answer without misrepresenting something or breaking a confidence, I will.

These can be summed up in the Golden Rule of Jesus, 'Do to others whatever you would like them to do for you.' Mark and I commend these rules to you and pledge to do what we can to keep our side of the deal and pray you will also extend us the same courtesy.



It is our prayer that Ivybridge Methodist Church will be a place of good, open, honest communication and that no gossip, complaining or critical attitudes will be allowed to separate any of us or drive anyone away. We want to have a reputation for being a church in which people feel safe from backbiting and hearsay, and where each person is valued and treated with dignity.

This takes a commitment from each one of us to refrain from negative speaking, to refuse to listen to negative speaking from others, to refuse to be easily offended by things others may say or do that we don't like and to work together to be gracious, merciful and tolerant of each other. We need to remember that church is not primarily a place to have our own preferences and desires met but a place where our core desire is to glorify Jesus and bring others to know His great love. We are not consumers but we are family and as such need to bear with one another in love.

We also want to remind everyone that if you know of someone in the church family going through a difficult time for any reason, we would really like to know about it if they are happy for you to share it with us. We may not be able to get to visit everyone but we would love to be able to pray for you and to encourage the rest of the church family to pray as well so that we can support each other as much as possible.

Be Careful What You Post on Facebook in Cambodia

I am often asked the question, "What is the situation in Cambodia now?" In the back of the questioner's mind is the legacy of the Khmer Rouge genocide, an awareness that Cambodia is still a developing country with problems of malnutrition, poverty and corruption, and perhaps an inkling that there is still instability and danger on the political scene.

To try to unravel and explain Cambodian politics is far beyond the scope of a short newsletter article, but here is one fact and some related background that may prompt you to pray that the Lord will bring peace and justice to Cambodia in greater measure than in recent years.

Fact: On 27 December 2016, Sam Rainsy, the President of the Cambodian National Rescue Party, was sentenced *in absentia* to five years in prison. The charge was posting on Facebook a fake treaty purporting to show Vietnam and Cambodia agreeing to get rid of their mutual boundary.

Background: Cambodia has been governed, either exclusively or briefly in coalition, by the same party since the Vietnamese army invaded Khmer Rouge-controlled Cambodia and set up a new government in January 1979. The party, now known as the Cambodian People's Party (CPP), is led by Hun Sen, who has been Cambodia's Prime Minister since 1985 and is one of the longest serving leaders in the world. Hen Sen was a Battalion Commander in the Khmer Rouge army until he fled to Vietnam. He was appointed Deputy Prime Minister in the Vietnam-instituted communist government in 1979.



Sam Rainsy founded an opposition party in 1995. the 2003 general election his party polled 22% of the vote. In 2012 the party merged with another to form the Cambodian National Rescue Party (CNRP), of which Sam Rainsy has been President ever since. 2013 election the the

CNRP secured 44.5% of the vote and won 55 out of 123 seats in the National Assembly. The CNRP claimed that if the election had been fair, they would have won a majority. Since 2005, Sam Rainsy has endured a succession of lawsuits and criminal charges during periods of self-imposed exile. The Vice-President of the CNRP spent several months holed up in the party headquarters fearing arrest for refusing to appear in court, but following a royal pardon granted at the request of Hun Sen he has emerged and taken up the role of leader of the opposition in the National Assembly.

In 2013, Hun Sen stated his intention to rule Cambodia until he is 74 (which will be in 2026). Many Cambodians fear what may happen if the CNRP continues to increase its share of the vote and the CPP loses the next general election in 2018. Hun Sen has an elite, well-armed bodyguard unit comprising several thousand troops. In 1997, when the junior partner in a coalition with a party headed by the then King's son, Hun Sen staged a bloody coup to oust his co-premier. Prior to the 2013 election, Hun Sen warned that Cambodia could descend into an 'internal war' akin to the Khmer Rouge period if the opposition won the election and carried through on a threat to arrest members of the current government.

Please pray: for peace, stability, righteous government, a climate in which political debate can take place without fear of reprisals, and for free and fair local elections to take place this year and a general election next year. Please pray for the salvation of communist/turned nominal Buddhist Hun Sen and probably more fervent Buddhist Sam Rainsy. Pray that ordinary Cambodian people will be able to live without fear of bloodshed and war and will find their ultimate security in a relationship with Jesus Christ.


O the bitter shame and sorrow, that a time could ever be,
