Letter from Mark

"There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens: A time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot, a time to kill and a time to heal, a time to tear down and a time to build, a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance, a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them, a time to embrace and a time to

refrain from embracing, a time to keep and a time to throw away, a time to tear and a time to mend, a time to be silent and a time to speak, a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace."

(Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 NIV)

October can be a weird time of year. It is a time of reduced daylight. It is a time of even more unpredictable weather than normal(!) and a time when we put the clocks back an hour (on the 28th) and British Summer Time ends! The Autumn is really in full flow!

As King Solomon said under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit in Ecclesiastes 'there is a time for everything, and a season...' Here at IMC we're in a time of continued transition. People move on and new people arrive! All very exciting, especially when it is in obedience to the ever-renewing Holy Spirit! Things are always becoming new — that is a good thing. It is a God-thing. Hopefully that doesn't describe your life at the moment, but if it does – take heart. Our God is the God of creation and renewal. He wants to, and has the power to, continually renew us and



remake us! He doesn't give us a spiritual make-over (i.e. covering up the cracks) but a completely new heart and mind! So if the season of today isn't going as planned – hold on! Trust Him. As someone once said, "Don't let where you are become a prophesy of where you're going to stay" and "Don't judge your future by the people who are betting you don't have one!"

Seasons may come and go, but God is beyond our human time zone and He is all powerful, all good and always with us!

In the life and ministry here at IMC we can be certain that, as we continue to go through times of change, His renewal power is at work as we seek to give Him all the glory, trust Him and refuse to let the past or the present dictate our destiny in Him. Hallelujah! The old has gone – the new is here!





A One-Party State



Fact: After what many perceive to be a 25-year-long failed attempt at democracy, Cambodia is now a one-party state.

The Cambodian People's Party won all 125 seats in the general election in July. The only viable opposition party, the Cambodia National Rescue Party

(CNRP), was dissolved last year by the Supreme Court and 118 of its members were banned from politics for five years. Although several opposition members who had been convicted of insurrection in connection with a street protest four years ago were released from prison after the election, CNRP leader Kem Sokha continues to be held in pre-trial detention on charges of treason. He has been in prison for over a year and at the end of August a judge extended his detention by a further six months.

18 of the 20 minor parties that stood in the election have joined a 'Consultation Forum' convened by the Prime Minister. "This forum will gather all political messages for the royal government as a contribution to the country's reconstruction," Hun Sen announced. "This is the culture of dialogue. We want a consultation between the government and the political parties outside the government." It is not yet clear what the forum will actually do.

Please pray:

- for Prime Minister Hun Sen and the government;
- for the establishment of a viable opposition;
- for freedom of speech without intimidation;
- for the preservation of freedom for the Cambodian church;
- that Cambodian Christians may know how to carry out the instructions of 1 Peter 3:13-14: 'Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every human authority: whether to the emperor, as the supreme authority, or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right.'

How well do we listen?

Listening is something we all do, isn't it? We listen to each other - or do we?

When someone is talking to you, do you ever find yourself thinking about what your reply is going to be?

For example, "Oh yes, I remember when that happened to me." or "Well, I don't agree, I think so and so."

Sometimes, of course, it is appropriate to respond to someone with a different perspective, but there are other times when we need to pause and ask ourselves whether we have really heard the other person.

Have we listened in a way that helps us really to understand their point of view? Or have we all too quickly responded from our own point of view?

To listen properly to another person matters very much, because in doing so we are implicitly showing not only our acceptance that what they are saying is valid for them, but, more importantly, we are reverencing them as persons, reverencing the Christ in them.

A source of deep healing

Many of us were not listened to with loving attention when we were children. Our needs and opinions weren't 'heard' or acknowledged. Thus, our sense of who we are, that is valued and valuable human beings, wasn't formed well in us.

As adults that shows itself in our poor self-image, which for some of us

can go further into an underlying sense of not knowing who we are at all.

When that's the case we function largely on the basis of what others think about us and the way in which they respond to us.

Thus, we are still looking to receive confirmation of our identity from outside, which we needed to receive as children.

Unconsciously, we are still looking for the loving response and affirmation that was our right as children.

Through receiving that we can develop a 'knowing' that 'God saw everything that He had made, and, behold, it was very good' (Gen 1:31); that sense that, although I sin and have faults which I need to repent of, I am basically OK through Christ who dwells in me.

So, listening with loving attention can be a source of deep healing to someone; simply being listened to properly - not being interrupted, not being criticised, not having their experience and understanding devalued by our opinions or attitudes.

It is a very valuable, healing gift which we can all share with others.
