Civic Service Sunday 19 November 2017

Over 100 people gathered at Ivybridge Methodist Church last month for a Civic Service, which is a tradition for Chairs and Mayors of Council, and to celebrate the community of Ivybridge. The service was attended by Civic leaders from across the area as well as local church and community representatives.

The concept for the occasion came from Councillor Kathy Cuthbert who thought it would be a good idea to gather local people together to recognize and commend all that is good about the community in an act of worship.

Several people took part in the service including Rev Chris Osborne who opened in prayer, Salvation Army Officers, Ian and Ruth Hammond who led prayers for various groups in the town and David Cuthbert who read a Bible passage. Mark gave a message based on the reading, encouraging everyone to love God and love their neighbours, seeking to serve others in all that we do.

Elis Norton gave a summary of the work carried out by the Bridge Project, seeking to help young people out and about on Friday nights in the skate park and an offering was taken to support this vital work (see page 18).

After the service, everyone was invited to stay behind for a wonderful selection of cakes with a cup of tea.

The service was a real success and it is hoped that at some point in the future another similar event may be organised and more local people encouraged to attend.



Who Made the Clothes You Are Wearing?

When you buy an article of clothing or footwear, do you ever check the label to find out where it was made? The chances are it has come from somewhere in Asia: perhaps China, Bangladesh or even Cambodia.

Fact: The EU is Cambodia's largest export market. Within the EU, the country receiving the largest proportion of Cambodia's exports is the United Kingdom.

Recently, a wage settlement was agreed for Cambodian garment workers. From 2018 their salary will increase from US\$153 to US\$170 a month. Yes, your expensive designer clothes could have been made by someone being paid £130 a month, say, 75p an hour.

Most Cambodian garment workers are young, unmarried women who leave their village homes, travel to the outskirts of cities where most factories are located, work long hours of overtime to supplement their meagre wages and send home as much as possible from their earnings to support their families.

Please pray:

- for workers who travel daily on overloaded trailers to and from their places of work;
- for women at risk of collapse from exhaustion or exposure to glue fumes in hot, poorly ventilated factories;
- for better wages and conditions, and for big-name distributors and retailers in the West to press manufacturers for improvements;
- for churches seeking to reach garment workers with the gospel.

Another fact: Agape International Missions (AIM), an organisation that rescues, restores and employs Cambodian victims of trafficking, pays those who work in its garment factories 400% higher wages than the national

average, as well as offering medical benefits, childcare, education classes during working hours, a social worker for every employee and optional daily Bible studies. More details in a future newsletter.







World Federation Day

On Saturday 28 October, around 50 people gathered from across the Connexion at the Side Door Methodist Church, Grimsby to celebrate World Federation Day. The theme was 'Mind the Gap - Gender Equality in the 21st Century', based on the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal 5, Gender Equality. This event is held each year on the nearest Saturday to 26 October in different locations around the country to mark the founding of World Federation of Methodist and Uniting Church Women (WFM&UCW), and in my new role it is my job to lead a task group to organise the day. The WFM&UCW is active in over 70 countries around the world, wherever there are national churches which are affiliated to the World Methodist Council.

We were welcomed by the warm hospitality of a fantastic team at Side Door Methodist Church who couldn't have been more welcoming and helpful and for whom nothing was too much trouble.



The opening worship was led by two of our district Methodist Women in Britain (MWiB) reps, and this was followed by a Bible study led by myself, based on a reading from Galatians 3:26-29 on the theme of 'One in Christ'. I spoke about how we find true equality when we discover our true identity in Jesus as beloved and valued children of God.

There followed a keynote speech from Alison Judd, the World President of the WFM&UCW. She spoke about issues of gender inequality in our own country and across the world and shared some of her experiences of her recent visit to Zimbabwe to celebrate 40 years of autonomous mission in the Methodist Church of Zimbabwe.

After lunch, everyone had the opportunity to participate in four different workshops.

 Rach Collins, presented a workshop on the theme of Female Genital Mutilation. She encouraged those present to write to their MPs to ask for education and awareness of FGM to be part of the school curriculum.



Emily Shurmer (our daughter!) from Middle East Media spoke about the work the charity is doing in the Middle East and North Africa using creative media. In culturally appropriate ways they are seeking to raise awareness about child marriages and to encourage the worth and self-esteem of women, helping them to gain confidence and make positive decisions in their lives as they learn about the love of Jesus.



- ◆ A third workshop was delivered by Tim Baker from All We Can, who shared the work that is being done amongst some of the most vulnerable and poverty stricken people in the world. He told the stories of how projects in Cameroon and Zimbabwe are helping women to lift their families out of poverty and giving them dignity and self-worth.
- ◆ The final workshop was led by two local ladies from the North East Lincolnshire Women's Aid, who talked about issues surrounding domestic violence in the UK and how they are working to help women who suffer in this way.

The day concluded with closing worship led by the President of MWiB, Sandra Goodwin, which included prayers of intercession about some of the topics from the day.

Many of those who attended expressed their gratitude for an interesting and inspiring day and lots of ideas about practical ways they can take action and show God's love for all people in this country and across the world.

IMC Youth Work News for this term : The Children becoming youth

God is doing some amazing things with our young people. Although we have more of a younger youth group forming, they will soon be ready for Soul Survivor and our Youth Bible Study. Our older youth attend this group in strong numbers each week and touch and inspire me on a regular



basis with how comfortable they are to invite their friends and share their faith with them.

KidsFest, our after school kids' club, continues to grow and see young people coming from outside the church. One of the mums messaged me to say, "I find it very hard to get them into any club - I have tried everything going and they are not interested, but they really enjoy Wednesdays, its the only club they have ever wanted to go back to! (One of them) has been to a few different clubs before but the other two have found it really hard (until now). Thank you!"

Recently I experienced a really special moment at one of our clubs. One of our young people was listening to one of the stories at KidFest and ran over to me "Phil I've finally got it! I never understood that story before!" We do urgently need some leaders just to be one on one at this club with a few that find it hard to listen.

We have already started planning this coming year's Beach Party and are really excited about the people we have approached to speak.

All our other groups keep ticking over and lots of young people are hearing the good news of Jesus. I also do assemblies which are amazing opportunities to see 200-300 young people hearing about Jesus.

On 12 and 13 November I attended Youthscape which is the national youth workers' weekend. This was an amazing opportunity to meet other youth workers, grow as a youth worker myself and hear about what God is doing around the UK with our amazing teens.

We do value your prayers as teams are small and sometimes the going is hard. But God is doing some awesome things!

On Sunday evenings from January we're going to be embarking on an exciting new chapter of discipleship at IMC. We are going to be running the Freedom In Christ course. It is an approach to discipleship that can transform the way we can become fruitful disciples.

Why take part in this course?

The Freedom in Christ course is for every Christian, from those who have been Christians for a long time to those who have only just made that decision, from those who are progressing steadily to those who feel stuck.

It is designed to help you:

Break through to a greater level of spiritual maturity
Uncover any areas of deception holding you back
Resolve personal and spiritual conflicts
Learn strategies to renew you mind and break free from negative thinking and unhelpful patterns of behaviour

The course does not focus on how to behave but on how to believe. After all, Christ has already set us free (Galatians 5:1) and given us everything we need (2 Peter 1:3). It's just that sometimes it doesn't feel like it!

Many sense that they have not reached their full potential for God. Perhaps they feel 'stuck' in habitual sin, negative thoughts, fears, unforgiveness or condemnation. Yet they really want to grow and mature. This course will help you grasp the amazing truth of your new identity in Christ, teach you to uncover and resist the enemy's deception, and help you move on. It's not a 'quick fix', but it is likely to revolutionise your Christian life.

How can I get the most out of it?

Do your best to get to each session (see dates and themes below). There is a Participants' Guide (£3.99), as well as recommended reading by Neil Anderson, that reinforces the course, entitled **Victory Over The Darkness** and **The Bondage Breaker.**

Make each session a spiritual priority and ensure you come along to **The Steps To Freedom In Christ Day** on **Saturday 16 June**, which is a kind and gentle



process during which you ask the Holy Spirit to show you any areas of your life where you may need to repent. It has been a life-changing experience for many participants.

Your Local YFC News

I'd like to share an update that I gave about The Bridge Project at the South Hams Civic Service last month that was very kindly held at IMC, and also thank you for your hospitality.



The Bridge Project started three years ago as the Church's response to some of the youth needs in Ivybridge Town Centre. We became aware that, following Government cuts and the subsequent closure of the Youth Centre, there could be a greater possibility that our young people could drift into anti-social behaviour. So, the Salvation Army, the Methodist Church and Youth For Christ decided to get to work with support from Ivybridge Town Council and the local Police.

And now, three years later, a group of 3 or 4 volunteers venture out every Friday night for 9 months of the year to serve free hot chocolate and biscuits to young people at the Skate Park. We finished our season last month, having started in March.

We have 16 people on the rota in all, mostly volunteers, many of whom have been at work during the week and give up their Friday night to care for our young people. And that's the heart of what we do, we care. We care because God cares, and we represent Him. He cares about the things that young people are struggling with and we do it to show them a little of that care.

When Jesus came to Earth, He came to serve and not to be served. We try and do the same, to serve young people a little love and understanding along with the hot chocolate and biscuits.

Many young people face all kinds of challenges in life and many do genuinely struggle to cope, not knowing even if they want to go on living. Anxiety, depression, suicidal thoughts and such-like are all too commonplace amongst our young people as well as in their family situations.

Some of the young people are encouraged by us to seek help from their GP, Young Devon or other places where they can receive support. On occasions, we have provided additional support outside of the Friday night service at some of our Church based youth groups, but we also see the need for some



young people to be supported regularly in mentoring type relationships and are looking into this. We are also considering whether we can develop the work to cover more weeks of the year.

We finish in November to avoid the harsher weather but we'd very much like to offer something in the Winter months that will provide warmth and shelter to those who want it. This is as well as maintaining the option of having that outside chat on their territory which so many young people currently feel comfortable with.

The Big Red Van that we use to transport our gazebo, refreshments, table and chairs is now very old and very unreliable. We really need to replace it soon and we are aiming long-term for a mobile youth unit of some sort like the one that they use at the Quay in Kingsbridge. We will need around £25k to do this properly and we've already started looking at grants to help. However, this may not be enough and so the offering at the Civic Service was gratefully accepted and will go in a separate Bridge Project account to help towards this goal. We were given £390 at the Civic Service offering which is fantastic. If you would like to support The Bridge Project please label any donations clearly for that account.

We don't charge for our services but on occasion it's been heart-warming to serve young people who have insisted on giving some of their money to help us with our next vehicle.

Thank you for your support, I hope Christmas comes early for our young people and that we reach our goal sooner rather than later. God bless you as you give and thanks again."


Have you thought of paying a visit to Wise and Wonderful?
