The Apostles' (1)

Line 10 "I believe in the holy catholic church"

What is the holy catholic church and why should we believe in it?

Let us look at those three words to help us understand what the Apostles' Creed is saying to us from the Word of God on which it is based.

Holy: Catholic: Church

1 Holy – What is holy?

Holiness is much mocked and maligned in our cynical society. To be called 'holy' can be an insult meaning you're sanctimonious, judgemental and/or legalistic. A Kill-joy!

But that is not what the Bible says. Far from it. God is holy (Hebrew *Kadosh*) – sacred; set apart; pure; undefiled; clean; free from defilement, profanity, idolatry.

"Who is My equal? Says the Holy One." (Isaiah 40:25)

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD God Almighty" (Isaiah 6:3)

And the Holy, Holy, God is looking for a holy people. "Speak to the entire assembly of Israel and say to them: 'Be holy because I, the LORD your God, am holy.'" (Leviticus 19:2)

It's not just an Old Testament thing, there are many references to holy and holiness in the New Testament too.

NT - Greek - hagiasmos

Holiness – sanctification – work of the wonderful Holy Spirit – He is Holy too! "Make every effort to live in peace with everyone and to be holy; without holiness no-one will see the Lord." (Hebrews 12:14)

"It is because of Him that you are in Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God – that is, our righteousness, holiness and redemption." (1 Corinthians .1:30)

Holiness is on God's agenda for His people – the Church.

2 Catholic

Catholic does not mean a denomination, but in its truest sense it is speaking about the whole true church (the Church Universal) made up of those who are born-again believers, the saints, which the Creed mentions later. There are many human institutions which claim to be church but are not. I've spoken about this before. There is the true Church – the real Body of Christ, and there



is another one - the **apostate church**, that which pretends to be church, but isn't; that which claims allegiance to God, but is more interested in the world and the flesh. It seeks to infiltrate and soil the holiness, devotion and allegiance of the saints of her Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, but is false, counterfeit and a cheap imitation, not the pure bride of Christ, but a harlot in a bride's dress

3 Church

In these last days we must be on our guard dear friends. We really need discernment of spirits, which is one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 12:10)

I read the other day from 2 Corinthians 11:4 where Paul wrote to the new Greek church –"For if someone comes to you and preaches a Jesus other than the Jesus we preached, or if you receive a different spirit from the Spirit you received, or a different gospel from the one you accepted, you put up with it easily enough."

Different Jesus : Different spirit : Different gospel

This is Paul writing only a few decades after the real Jesus has ascended into heaven. This letter could have been written as early as AD55, and counterfeits were already there! Even more so 21 centuries later!

So the big question is - How can we discern what is true and what is false? There is no easy answer. In Hebrews we are told, "But solid food is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil." (Hebrews 5:14)

Sound doctrine! This is reading, knowing, believing and obeying the Word of God! No short-cuts – no easy answers – a lifestyle of seeking and surrendering to the Holy Spirit. Regular, systematic study of the Bible – reading, rereading and reading again – all of Scripture! We need a hunger for God and His Holy word.

The Apostle Paul writing in 1 Timothy 1:3-11 to a young pastor Timothy says, There are many voices saying many things contrary to the word of God. However, if our desire is to truly love God, to bring Him glory, to love His Only Begotten Son (which includes His Body – the Church) and to be open to His wonderful Holy Spirit – the Spirit of Truth – He will keep and guide us.

Love for Him is the key – that is why Paul says in verse5 - "The goal of this command is love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith".

As we read earlier this flows from seeking to advance the work of God. What we believe affects who we are, that is why the Apostle Paul goes on to say later in the same letter to Timothy - "Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers." (1 Timothy 4:16)

During my ministry I have always tried to encourage individual believers to be part of their local church and to serve the Lord Jesus through the local expression of His body. For various reasons some have chosen to 'go it alone'. A few have had legitimate reasons, because they have been badly hurt by supposed Christians or genuine ones who are rude and ignorant!

I met with a local pastor the other day and we were talking about various attacks to our faith. The greatest (sadly) comes from those of our own number, who have turned on their leaders with cold, merciless, murderous, hatred and utter disdain for the one who is trying to lead them in holiness and truth. I commented that the most vicious spirits of all are the unclean religious ones who occasionally manifest through church folk. The devil loves nothing more than for Christians to be fighting with Christians.

However, some use this as an excuse not to bother with being in fellowship — this is dangerous and counter-productive. The devil's strategy is to divide and conquer. The truth is that we cannot be right with the real Jesus Christ if we are not an active part of His body. You cannot love Jesus and not love His Body - the Church.

As divided and messed up, in places, it is – it is still the Body of Christ, here on earth. We are the Body of Christ! We're either part of the problem or part of the answer! It's our choice!

That is why this line is an essential part of the Apostles' Creed – and not just an afterthought or additional add-on. Part of true doctrinally-pure, Christ-centred, Holy Spirit-led, whole-life discipleship is expressed through our belonging to God and to one another as the Holy, Universal Church. That is why I'm trying to encourage as many as possible here at IMC to become full members – an intentional act of saying – I'm in! I'm with you! I'm standing up to be counted as part of this Church, which genuinely seeks and is part of the true global Body of Christ –the holy, catholic church – by doctrine and by a pure heart, good conscience and sincere faith.

"I believe in the holy, catholic church."

Amen.

Lethal Legacy of Vietnam War Still Blights Cambodia



Fact: More than 40 years after the end of the Vietnam war, chemical bombs dropped by the United States on Cambodia are still being exposed and adversely affecting the health of Cambodian villagers.

Between March 1969 and May 1970, the United States carried out a covert bombing campaign over areas of Cambodia bordering Vietnam in an attempt to destroy sanctuaries and base areas of the People's Army of Vietnam and forces of the Viet Cong, which utilised them for resupply, training and resting between campaigns across the border in South Vietnam. This was followed between May 1970 and August 1973 by a wider bombing campaign covering most of the eastern half of Cambodia. It has been claimed that between 1965 and 1973, the United States dropped about 2.7 million tons of explosives on 113,716 locations in Cambodia (the Allies dropped just over 2 million tons of bombs during all of World War II). There were perhaps 50,000 to 150,000 civilian casualties.

Now, after lying buried for four decades, chemical bombs are still coming to the surface. According to the Cambodian Foreign Ministry, there are 34 locations known to contain chemical barrel bombs throughout the country. In December 2017, Cambodia called in experts from the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons to analyse the bombs. They confirmed that the barrel bombs were chemical weapons but have not yet identified the exact type.

In one location where bombs were found, 32 Cambodian villagers were hospitalised with skin and respiratory complaints which could have been caused by exposure to CS gas. The Ministry of Health announced that three children in the bomb-affected areas had been born with defects, though the US embassy rejected claims that bombs containing CS gas could have been a cause.

Please pray:

- for the identification and clearance of all remaining bombs, whether chemical or high explosive;
- for the recovery of those whose health has been affected;
- that chemical weapons may never again be used in Cambodia.
