A Letter from Carolyn

In the book of Esther, Mordecai calls upon the queen to help speak up for her people and says to her, 'Who knows but that you have come to your royal position for such a time as this.' This passage has meant a lot to me in recent years as God has directed me down some unexpected and



exciting paths and given me the opportunity to speak his word into all sorts of situations. Now God has called me to a new and exciting opportunity and just as Esther called upon everyone who knew her to fast and pray as she stepped out in obedience, I will be asking for a lot of prayer support in the coming months.

Some of you know that at the Methodist annual conference in June, I was elected to be the next Vice President of the Methodist Conference for the year 2020-21. Every year, since the time of Wesley, the Methodist church elect a President, who is an ordained minister and a Vice President, who is a lay person, to preside over the conference, form part of the leadership and exercise a ministry of visitation to the districts of the Methodist Church – it is therefore a great honour to be elected.

It is not a position I have sought after but God has clearly directed me to this calling through many people who have encouraged me and asked me to stand to test the call. I said to God that I would be willing to serve in this way if I can use it to bring glory and honour to Jesus and I will do my best to fulfil that call. Many of you know that the Methodist Church is in a time of uncertainty and change and like Esther, I have a real sense that God has called me to this role 'for such a time as this.'

I now have a quiet few months at home before this all begins with my induction at the conference in Telford next June and Mark and I will be seeking your prayerful support in the coming year or so.

In August I marked the 40 year anniversary of becoming a Christian and as I look back over the years I am in awe of the way God has moved in my life and the paths that have led to this time and place. I am reminded that when we seek to offer our lives in obedience to Jesus, no experience of our lives – good or bad - is wasted – seasons come and go but God can use it all in his plan if we are open to him.



This church year has been designated as a year of testimony and we look forward to receiving your written testimonies that we can use in future magazines and in services. I pray as we hear and read testimonies from many of you in the coming year, we will all be encouraged by the way Jesus is still changing lives and making us more like him so that a needy and lost world will know of his love.

Discipleship at IMC Sunday Evening Meetings in Autumn 2019

In what we now call the Great Commission, Jesus said this, "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you". Discipleship is both 'going out' to spread the good news and 'being together' to grow in our understanding and our practice. Perhaps it's worth saying that going out and being together are designed to enhance each other!

This autumn, our discipleship theme in our 'together time' will be 'Hearing God'. The Sunday evening meeting dates, led by Mark, Phil or Jean, are below and all are at 6:30 pm at IMC.

Listening to God is three evenings on discovering how God speaks to us and gaining confidence in hearing him. We will be looking at how to listen to God for both ourselves and others and will include a time of simple practice each night.

Lectio Divina (Latin for Divine Reading) is an ancient practice dating back to the early Church. In essence, Lectio Divina is a simple way to meet with the Lord, through reflection and prayer, based on the Bible. It does not depend on background knowledge of the Bible, but is a way of allowing God to speak personally to us, through his written word. We shall be working as a group, but you will be able to take this and use it in your personal prayer times.

The topic for the first evening has been left open at the moment.

Finance Update

Back at the start of this year the church was facing a difficult financial situation. We were running at about £12,000 p.a. below what we needed in the General Fund. This meant that we no longer held the reserves that we are required to as a charity. Additionally, we were eating into the Youth Vision Fund reserves at about £11,000 p.a.; such that this fund (which pays for our Youth Worker, Phil) would run out of money sometime in February next year.

In short, we were spending beyond our means; and as we had already reduced discretionary spending as much as was practical, and sought to maximise our other income, this only meant one thing – we had to address our individual giving.

This led to the establishment of the Finance Action Team (often referred to as "the Fatties"!!) and the Giving Campaign that we ran through the month of March.

I am very pleased to report that God has moved through you all, and our giving to the General Fund has increased by £1,000 per month (just enough to cover the deficit we were running), and one very generous, anonymous member of the congregation has offered to cover the shortfall on the YVF through to the end of Phil's contract in July 2021!

So, I want to take this opportunity to most sincerely thank you all for your generosity, and to praise God for His bountiful goodness.

This has stabilised our on-going financial position, but there will always be the need for "special projects", especially with a building the age of ours. The next one of these is to refurbish the Concourse, more information on this project is on the next page.

2019 Gift Day

In recent years it has been our practice to hold an annual Gift Day in order to fund special projects within the church. Last year we decided not to do this as the general financial position of the church was deteriorating and urgently needed to be addressed. This required a focus on our regular giving, not a special one off. We therefore cancelled last year's Gift Day and launched the successful Giving Campaign that is reported on the previous page.

Having addressed the on-going situation, we still have the need to fund "one-off" projects, so we have decided to reinstate the annual Gift Day. As in previous years, we have decided to align this with Harvest Festival, as it seems appropriate the we should offer something extra back to God and His work in this place as a thank you for the "harvest" He has allowed us all to gather in our various walks of life.

The selected project for this year is the refurbishment of the Concourse, which is looking very tired and is the first point of contact when people visit the church. We want to make this a brighter, more welcoming space. Any giving over and above that needed for the concourse will be used for other building related projects around the church (of which there is never a shortage!!)

We also believe that the more we give, the more God is generous to us, and this applies to us corporately as a church, as well as to us as individuals. Therefore, we have decided to tithe the gifts received on Gift Day to the All We Can "Hope is Taking Root" Harvest 2019 appeal. All We Can is the Methodist Church's relief and development organisation, and their Harvest appeal this year is targeted at helping poor farming families in Cherkos in Ethiopia by providing them with seeds to plant (especially seed potatoes) and training on how to maximise their crops in the uncertain weather conditions that they face.

Christmas Angels



After last year's amazing success of distributing the angels around lyybridge, the stewards have requested that we 'do' this project again. So, those of you that participated last year perhaps you could start getting those needles out again, and if you didn't then maybe you could get involved this year.

The Aim: To share God's love and to bless the community we live in with a free Christmas decoration that comes with a message of hope at Christmas-time.

The Idea: Knit lots of angel decorations, attach a message of Christmas hope, and in one co-ordinated event leave them in (hopefully) hundreds of locations across our community for people to find (this is known as "yarn bombing").

Where did the idea originate? We got the idea from a friend of mine whose church in Fleet, Hampshire joined in last year (she is Sue Butterfield, who used to live in Ivybridge, so many of you probably know her). However, the idea originally came from the North Shields and Whitley Bay Methodist Circuit near Newcastle. In the past three years they (and churches like ours across the country) have knitted over 70,000 angels, and some of them have turned up as far away as South Africa!

What do we want you to do? Get yourself and your friends knitting angels – we need hundreds of them! Last year we made over 500!

Where do I get a pattern for the angels? There are already hard copies of the knitting pattern available on the noticeboard in the Concourse at church, or you can download an electronic copy from:

We will collect the angels from all you avid knitters (there will be a collection box in the Concourse at church from November onwards), and we'll print and attach the Christmas message labels; then on a date in the few weeks before Christmas we will organise the yarn bombing. If you want to be a part of this, please let us know and we'll rope you in! At the time of writing the exact date for the bombing has not yet been agreed. We will also register our project with the original scheme so that it will be part of this much bigger venture.

In the May newsletter, I wrote about some problems that Cambodian Communities out of Crisis (CCC) were experiencing with our bank account in Cambodia. Things went downhill after that and we ended up having to close the account. This was by no means straightforward, involving various documents having to go back and forth in the slow postal service between here and Cambodia. But thanks, firstly to the Lord for protecting His money and enabling us to finally extract it from the bank and use it for His purposes, and secondly to the Bittaford prayer group, who prayed with much faith, week after week, while we struggled with obstructions, delays and bureaucracy.

Thank You Number 2

Without a bank account in Cambodia, we have had to find other ways of getting funds into the country. Some of the money that CCC is given is used to help pay the fees of children at Asian Hope International School and we

thank the Lord that it has been possible for us to send this money to the school's parent organisation in the USA with lower bank charges than would have applied if we had sent it directly to Cambodia. We trust the Lord that He will show us how to get money to the other causes that we support.
