It will examine the strength in letting go of the need to be in control as well as looking at how we can stop comparing ourselves to others and instead live authentically and honestly as we grow into the people God has created us to be. Much of the material will be taken from Patrick's new book of the same title.

Patrick will be exploring themes from his latest book, 'Honesty Over Silence', and Diane will be performing songs around the theme of honesty, faith and hope. In the 1970s, **Cambodia** endured a civil war that ended in victory for a faction that proceeded to exterminate over a quarter of the country's population. Now, Cambodians are fearful that armed conflict could return to their nation.

Fact: Exiled opposition leader Sam Rainsy has vowed to return to **Cambodia** on 9 November. His arch-enemy, Prime Minister Hun Sen, has threatened to respond with military force. He said Rainsy had claimed to have the support of more than 65% of the armed forces.

"If you [Rainsy] have armed forces then I must fight you. I must fight you anywhere I see you, without needing a warrant," Hun Sen said in a speech to high school students. He warned that anyone showing support for Rainsy would be arrested immediately and face a long jail term.

In 1997, Hun Sen was unafraid to use the army against his co-Prime Minister Prince Norodom Ranariddh.

Pray: Please pray for peace and stability in Cambodia; for people who are afraid; for Christians to be peacemakers; for the defeat of the powers of darkness that would promote strife, violence and death; for the Love Phnom Penh Festival (an evangelistic crusade planned for December) to go ahead without disruption.

Churches Together in Ivybridge

Discipleship at IMC Sunday Evening Meetings in Autumn 2019

In what we now call the Great Commission, Jesus said this, "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you". Discipleship is both 'going out' to spread the good news and 'being together' to grow in our understanding and our practice. Perhaps it's worth saying that going out and being together are designed to enhance each other!

This autumn, our discipleship theme in our 'together time' will be 'Hearing God'. The Sunday evening meeting dates, led by Mark, Phil or Jean, are below and all are at 6:30 pm at IMC.

Listening to God is three evenings on discovering how God speaks to us and gaining confidence in hearing him. We will be looking at how to listen to God for both ourselves and others and will include a time of simple practice each night.

Lectio Divina (Latin for Divine Reading) is an ancient practice dating back to the early Church. In essence, Lectio Divina is a simple way to meet with the Lord, through reflection and prayer, based on the Bible. It does not depend on background knowledge of the Bible, but is a way of allowing God to speak personally to us, through his written word. We shall be working as a group, but you will be able to take this and use it in your personal prayer times.

The topic for the first evening has been left open at the moment.

You'll need a recent bill handy and an online comparison site like U Switch or Simply Switch (others available). If you need some help, you're not alone, as often it can be pretty confusing.

Here are some suppliers to look out for:

Good Energy and Ecotricity – the top choice, most ethical and greenest, building new renewables, but they are a bit more expensive.

Octopus Energy – more affordable, doing lots of interesting innovation projects to try and make our energy system smarter.

Other suppliers that we know good things about Bulb, iSupply, Bristol Energy, Co-op Energy.

If you choose Octopus Energy, I have a code where you can also get £50 credit and I will get £50 credit which I will then donate to the church.

Last year we raised £700 for IMC from people using my referral code to switch to Bulb. Now I've switched to Octopus to try them out too, and am happy to recommend both companies.

Christmas Angels



After last year's amazing success of distributing the angels around Ivybridge, the stewards have requested that we 'do' this project again. So, those of you that participated last year perhaps you could start getting those needles out again, and if you didn't then maybe you could get involved this year.

The Aim: To share God's love and to bless the community we live in with a free Christmas decoration that comes with a message of hope at Christmas-time.

The Idea: Knit lots of angel decorations, attach a message of Christmas hope, and in one co-ordinated event leave them in (hopefully) hundreds of locations across our community for people to find (this is known as "yarn bombing").

Where did the idea originate? We got the idea from a friend of mine whose church in Fleet, Hampshire joined in last year (she is Sue Butterfield, who used to live in Ivybridge, so many of you probably know her). However, the idea originally came from the North Shields and Whitley Bay Methodist Circuit near Newcastle. In the past three years they (and churches like ours across the country) have knitted over 70,000 angels, and some of them have turned up as far away as South Africa!

What do we want you to do? Get yourself and your friends knitting angels – we need hundreds of them! Last year we made over 500!

Where do I get a pattern for the angels? There are already hard copies of the knitting pattern available on the noticeboard in the Concourse at church, or you can download an electronic copy from:

We will collect the angels from all you avid knitters (there will be a collection box in the Concourse at church from November onwards), and we'll print and attach the Christmas message labels; then on a date in the few weeks before Christmas we will organise the yarn bombing. If you want to be a part of this, please let us know and we'll rope you in! At the time of writing the exact date for the bombing has not yet been agreed. We will also register our project with the original scheme so that it will be part of this much bigger venture.

The Report of the Marriage & Relationships Task Group 2019

The traditional teaching of the church, and within the evangelical tradition is that marriage is part of:

God's Plan

Marriage has a divine origin and is part of the pattern of God's good creation, deeply written into our existence. When asked about divorce Jesus said:

"Haven't you read," he replied, "that at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female', and said 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh'?"

God's Purpose

God created male and female to live in union with each other – companions who were different and designed to work together, to complement each other, and to procreate. Such marriage provides a solid foundation for family and society, and God blesses such a union (**Genesis 1:28**).

God's Word

Within the evangelical tradition it is argued that is impossible to redefine marriage without compromising the authority of the Bible. Clause 4 of the Methodist Deed of Union states:

'The doctrines of the evangelical faith which Methodism has held from the beginning and still holds are based upon the divine revelation recorded in the Holy Scriptures. The Methodist Church acknowledges this revelation as the supreme rule of faith and practice.'

The Marriage and relationships report

This report seeks to re-define the church's position on marriage and relationships and the 2019 Conference provisionally passed a number of resolutions (Resolutions 10.2, 10.3, 10.7, 10.8 and 10.9). Conference has asked church's to consult on these resolutions which are laid out below.

Please indicate on the voting slip (last page of newsletter) whether you agree, disagree or don't know against the resolutions.

10.2 Statement: A summary understanding of the principles of good relating "All significant relationships should be built on self-giving love, commitment, fidelity, loyalty, honesty, mutual respect, equality and the desire for the mutual flourishing of the people involved.



It is through that self-giving, rather than through self-seeking, that the self flourishes and begins to experience life in all its fullness (though it needs to be recognised that the universal Church's historic emphasis on self-sacrifice has often been misunderstood and misused [e.g. by abusive partners] in a way that is destructive of the wellbeing of the ones abused [often women])."

10.3 The Church should adopt the following understanding of co-habitation "The Church recognises that the love of God is present within the love of human beings who are drawn to each other, and who enter freely into some form of life-enhancing committed relationship with each other, whether that be through informal cohabitation or a more formal commitment entered into publicly.

As a Church we wish to celebrate that the love of God is present in these circumstances, even if that grace is not responded to or even discerned by the people concerned.

The Church has an important calling, therefore, to point to the presence of God's love within such relationships, and to encourage people to respond to it in the renewing and deepening (by whatever means) of their commitment."

10.7 That the Guidance on the Understanding of Marriage in the Task Group report be adopted. This 'understanding' incorporates the following elements:

- The church welcomes everyone who enquires about intended marriage, and looks for an openness to God and not necessarily a developed Christian faith.
- The Methodist Church believes that marriage is a covenant relationship between two people, within God's covenant of love with them. Through it, they may experience, explore and express God's gracious love.
- Marriage is an exclusive relationship, freely entered into with a life-long intention of uniting two people in body, heart, mind and soul in ways that are appropriate to each partner. Through such marriage children may be nurtured, family life strengthened, and human society enriched.
- The Methodist Church recognises that amongst its members different views are held about the interpretation of the Bible and Christian tradition as to whether those being married may be any two people, or may only be a woman and a man. The Methodist Church has decided to respect and make practical provisions for both positions.



- Where there is a desire to use places of worship for marriage services or for services of blessing for a marriage previously solemnised, the managing trustees of those premises should actively consider whether they wish to do so solely for marriages of mixed-sex couples, or for marriages of same-sex couples.
- 10.8 <u>That Conference consents to the marriage of same sex couples and permits the Trustees of the church to register the premises for the marriage of such sex couples.</u>
- **10.9** Amendment of Standing Orders so that they incorporate the following statements:

Marriage

The Methodist Church believes that marriage is given by God to be a particular channel of God's grace, and that it is in accord with God's purposes when a marriage is a life-long union in body, mind and spirit of people who freely enter it.

The Methodist Church welcomes everyone, whether or not a member, who enquires about an intended marriage in any of its places of worship.

Divorce, Remarriage and Respect for Conscience

Divorce in a court of the land, and matters of sex or gender do not of themselves prevent a person being married in any Methodist place of worship.

Under no circumstances does the Conference require any minister to officiate at or participate in the marriage of a particular couple, should it be contrary to the dictates of his or her conscience to do so.

Couples who wish to be married at premises that are not registered for those purposes or where the minister is not able to officiate for reasons of conscience shall be referred to the District Chair.

You are asked to vote on each of the provisional recommendations and return the slip to the box in the concourse. Additional voting slips are available in the concourse if there are two or more members of the church congregation in the household.
