## Discipleship at IMC Sunday Evening Meetings in Autumn 2019

In what we now call the Great Commission, Jesus said this, "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you". Discipleship is both 'going out' to spread the good news and 'being together' to grow in our understanding and our practice. Perhaps it's worth saying that going out and being together are designed to enhance each other!

This autumn, our discipleship theme in our 'together time' will be 'Hearing God'. The Sunday evening meeting dates, led by Mark, Phil or Jean, are below and all are at 6:30 pm at IMC.

Lectio Divina (Latin for Divine Reading) is an ancient practice dating back to the early Church. In essence, Lectio Divina is a simple way to meet with the Lord, through reflection and prayer, based on the Bible. It does not depend on background knowledge of the Bible, but is a way of allowing God to speak personally to us, through his written word. We shall be working as a group, but you will be able to take this and use it in your personal prayer times.



We still meet a good group of teenagers each week with **Wired**, our Youth Group and **Youth Fellowship**, our Discipleship Group and then we join with **Youth For Christ** with the younger School Christian Union.

This Sunday we took **Youth Fellowship** to Adrenaline Inflatables and Trampoline Park and offered for them to bring a Plus One. We met 10 young people there, one of which hasn't been to church in a long time but made a commitment to Jesus at a beach party quite a few years ago. Isn't God good.

#### **Light Party 2019**

We had a lot of fun on the 31st October providing an alternative to Halloween with our Light Party. We had a Disco Bouncy Castle, Mega Slide, Candy Floss, Chocolate Fountain, Glitter Tattoos and so much more. As a friend said, if we are going to do justice to the kids, we need to provide more sweets than they would get on the door and more fun than Halloween parties because Jesus Light always wins over darkness. We had kids over the two light parties, 44 to the younger age group 11 to the older. Lots of these were unchurched families and just wanted a safe place where they could bring their kids.



#### The BIG START

We also kicked off our new style of family service the **BIG START**, where we provided breakfast and an action-packed, fun-filled service with **Kids Songs**, **Games**, **Preachtasic** and so much more challenging them to try praying.

We had two new families try this, unfortunately, one thought it was at 10:30 but still enjoyed that service. This family heard about it through one of our kids being so excited about **Big Start** she was telling her friends. As a youth worker that is a place I want to be where, young people are so excited about Church they can't help but tell their friends.

#### **Primary school Group Work**

Our Kids work is still going well. With regularly seeing over 30 kids a week. This term we are doing the theme, **Little People who do Big Things**. It has been awesome to talk through some of the characters in the Bible who God used, even though they were young and unexpected.

I think this is a challenge for me and the church as a whole. So often we invite the kids to be involved once they have got to a certain age. But maybe, just maybe, God could do some Big Things through our Little People, like our little girl who was so excited about The **Big Start** she told all her friends at school and a family came to Church from that.

Like I said last time, I have gone back to school to study for a degree in Theology. I am enjoying my day a week studying and really going deep into some of the challenges in scripture and the church. I have already found the things I'm learning impacting my everyday job.



You'll need a recent bill handy and an online comparison site like U Switch or Simply Switch (others available). If you need some help, you're not alone, as often it can be pretty confusing.

Here are some suppliers to look out for:

Good Energy and Ecotricity – the top choice, most ethical and greenest, building new renewables, but they are a bit more expensive.

Octopus Energy – more affordable, doing lots of interesting innovation projects to try and make our energy system smarter.

Other suppliers that we know good things about Bulb, iSupply, Bristol Energy, Co-op Energy.

If you choose Octopus Energy, I have a code where you can also get £50 credit and I will get £50 credit which I will then donate to the church.

Last year we raised £700 for IMC from people using my referral code to switch to Bulb. Now I've switched to Octopus to try them out too, and am happy to recommend both companies.
