As I write this article I'm looking ahead! I've noticed that it's Mothering Sunday on 22nd March. Quick, if you read this at the beginning of March and you had forgotten, you have plenty of time to sort out something appropriate! For some of you reading this, your mother is only a distant memory — either good or bad, but hopefully good. For others it is someone who is still present and part of your lives.

In John chapter 2 there is an interesting dialogue between Jesus and His mother. They'd gone to a wedding in Cana. It could have been some relative of theirs as a problem developed and Mary consulted Jesus about it. At the wedding reception the wine had run out. Yikes! This was not a good situation to be in. We don't know if not enough was ordered or this was a particularly boozy do which had caught the organisers off-guard! However, Mary knew that Jesus was no ordinary man and she spoke to Him about it. His reply was intriguing. He said to her, 'Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come.' (John 2:4)

If I'd spoken like that to my mother I might not be writing this article now! However, such was their understanding of one another that Mary didn't seem to bat an eyelid. She simply says to those in charge, 'Do whatever he tells you'. (John 2:5) The result is amazing. Jesus turns about 120 gallons of water into top quality wine. Despite the potential head-ache the following day we're told, 'his disciples believed in him.' (John 2:11)

Whether Mothering Sunday is a good, bad or sad day for you for whatever reason, we can know that Jesus is able to turn past and present troubles into something beautiful. He can redeem the past and bring hope out of our present challenges, fears, disappointments and plans. But only if we're prepared to do whatever he says.

As a church, as individuals and as families may we be enabled to put

Jesus at the centre of our lives knowing that through Him we can know God as our Father, our loving parent, who cares, who helps and who is always present.

You are what you eat?

We hear a lot these days about the way our eating habits affect our planet and many news reports and magazine articles would have us believe that the most ethical way we can eat is by choosing a vegetarian or vegan diet. In fact some pressure groups are pretty aggressive in their campaigning to encourage people to stop eating meat of any kind. But are things always that simple?

I'm no expert but have read a lot around this subject and have noticed that there are a lot of ethical issues around some ingredients used in vegetarian diets that are not being highlighted. We are bombarded with a confusing array of products to supposedly help us eat more healthily and I guess that most of us rarely, if ever, look more deeply into where these products originate or the affect their production has on the local people, environment and economy.

So for example take coconuts. A product that is now available in a bewildering array of formats. According to the UN the demand for coconuts is growing at 10% annually. The amount spent on coconut products in the U.K has risen from £3.4 million in 2014 to £25 million in 2017. And yet behind this seemingly miracle food item lie serious ethical issues. As coconut consumption has soared, the production in countries such as Indonesia and the Philippines has increased and the people who grow them are often living below the poverty line while a few fat cats glean the financial rewards. Also, in some countries monkeys are trained to harvest coconuts - either captured from the wild or bred in captivity for the purpose. They are forced to work gruelling hours, kept on tight leashes and suffer cruelty at the hands of their owners. That's not to mention the effect of over production on the price of coconut for locals or the food miles associated with transportation.

Then there is soya. A product used in many meat alternatives. Soya production is one of two main causes of deforestation in Brazil, along with cattle ranching.

Quinoa is another ingredient hailed as a wonder food and much of our quinoa is imported from Bolivia where it is the staple diet of many poor Bolivians. Due to the increasing demand on this product and associated price rise (the price has tripled since 2006),

many Bolivians can no longer afford this basic ingredient and it now costs more than chicken in Lima. There is pressure to turn land over to production creating a quinoa monoculture instead of diversity in farming. The exportation of such huge amounts of the product is damaging the food security of that country.

Peru has cornered the world market in asparagus which is depleting their water resources while labourers live and work in substandard conditions. And again there are those food miles.

So what's the answer? How do we eat ethically and responsibly? I don't think that we need to go vegetarian or vegan to achieve that and can enjoy all things in moderation - as the Bible teaches us, God has made all foods clean and we are free to eat whatever we wish. I believe that we need to think carefully about where our food originates and try to limit our dependence on imported food. The meat I buy from our local butcher comes from local farms and has been well looked after to strict welfare standards. It is a little more expensive than supermarket meat but superior quality so we can eat less of it. We can try to seek out locally produced and seasonal fruit and vegetables to cut down the food miles of our meals. If we do buy imported products, let's look to buy Fairtrade goods as much as possible and organic produce that has less of an impact on our environment. And grow our own where possible! And as around 30% of food in households in the U.K. is purportedly thrown away we can look at ways of cutting down waste and using everything up. If we buy a bit less we are likely to have less waste anyway.

I believe that if we start eating more ethically we may end up having to eat a little less but our diets will be healthier, we'll spend a bit less, and we'll be playing our part in helping this beleaguered planet and its people. As Christians, this is one important way that we can demonstrate our love for God and for our fellow human beings and our stewardship of this wonderful world.



An Opening Door and a Battle to be Fought

Cambodian Communities out of Crisis (CCC), which IMC has faithfully

and generously supported over many years, is on the threshold of undertaking a new ministry in Cambodia.

A year ago, I wrote about the Cambodia for Christ (CfC) sports ministry, founded and led by Pov Phearun, which has been successful in sharing the gospel with young people through their involvement in a football team with the added benefit of keeping them away from drugs and criminal gangs.

CfC is based in the village of Chheu Teal, south-east of Phnom Penh. As well as managing the football team, Phearun also runs evening classes to help the village children and young people learn English, an important skill to acquire in Cambodia.

English Courses

CCC now has the opportunity to work more closely with CfC with the long-term aim of helping them buy land for a practice pitch and erect a building that can be used for classrooms for the English courses and other subjects. CCC is also looking at ways of working with Phearun's church, Chheu Teal Light of God Church. We anticipate forming a team of women led by our Country Director Ms Huot Chanthoeun to work with the widows, orphans and poor people of Chheu Teal and take the gospel to the surrounding villages where there is no Christian witness.

Please could you pray for the CCC Council, which will meet on Saturday 14th March to pray, seek the Lord, discern what His will is and decide on how to move forward?

In December 2018, our International Director was looking forward to preaching at the Chheu Teal Light of God Church when he had a heart attack. I preached at the church on 15th December 2019 and eight days later suffered a head injury. A friend of CCC recently went to Chheu Teal to record a segment for a video he was creating.



The following week, he experienced severe tooth problems which required extensive dental surgery. Phearun's wife and son have both been ill; his wife had to be admitted to hospital.

Coincidence? I do not think so. I suspect that there is a demonic power over the village or a wider area that does not want to be forced to loose its hold over people in darkness there and it will do all it can to hinder, frustrate or harm those who dare to oppose it in the name of the Lord Jesus.

In *Ephesians 6:16*, we are told to take up the shield of faith with which we shall be able to extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Roman soldiers would advance against an enemy in testudo formation, holding their large shields around and above the group. We are to advance against the evil one in united faith, our shields interlocked and impenetrable by his flaming arrows of sickness, accident or anything else. Would you stand in faith with Phearun, Chanthoeun, her team, the church and the CCC Council as we seek to proclaim the gospel of our Lord Jesus in word and deed and push back the powers of darkness in Chheu Teal and the surrounding area?
