# A new minister for Ivybridge

As most people will be aware, **Mark and Carolyn** will be moving to a new appointment in 2021 and we wish them all the best in their new churches.

The Circuit has therefore been in the 'stationing' process by which churches where there are ministerial vacancies are 'matched' to ministers who are due to move. In these unusual times, rather than the normal visits and face to face discussions this has all taken place via virtual on-line discussions. It was always possible that we might not get a minister as there are more vacancies than ministers to be stationed, but I am pleased to say that we have been matched and, subject to formal ratification by the Methodist Conference next year, the **Rev. Amanda Roper** will be the new minister **for lyybridge, Bittaford and Yealmpton.** 

Amanda will be moving to Ivybridge with her husband Mark next summer and will take up post from September 2021. She comes from Cornwall and has two daughters aged 23 and 19. Her original background is as a nursery nurse and a family worker before going into ministerial training. Within the church she has worked in the Bury Circuit (2009 – 2014) before moving to her current post in Sussex.

Ministers prepare a synopsis about themselves for the stationing process and the following is brief extract from how she currently exercises her ministry and sees her skills gifts and strengths.

- "• seek to follow a biblical, Jesus-centred, Holy Spirit inspired pattern of ministry.
- love preaching, especially in the open air, and regularly speak at large gatherings of worship/witness events in public/town settings
- naturally creative art/craft/music



- experienced ministering in Local Ecumenical Partnerships; and have recently brought two congregations together - Methodist and URC- to form new LEP in current appointment
- skilled with ministry alongside children and families Messy Church, Holiday Clubs and have overseen several church-based toddler groups
- primary school chaplaincy enjoy leading assemblies, engaging with school visits to church and have run 'Journey to Christmas' and 'Journey to Easter' experiences
- Intergenerational Worship, Café Worship and Multi-Sensory Worship"

We believe that **Amanda** will be able to build on the work that **Mark & Carolyn** have undertaken to help us grow as a church and I am sure that we would all wish to pray for her in this role and for **Mark & Carolyn** in their new churches.

Harry is really enjoying the course and I am working with him closely to empower him to achieve his full potential. I believe God has amazing plans for Harry and he and I would value your prayers. #### Kids

Thank you for all your prayers in this time. As for everyone, this has been a very strange time and many things have had to cancel.



We have been able to prepare **Kingdom Kids** videos for a lot of lockdown and have transitioned to **Kingdom Kids LIVE on ZOOM** for the rest of the year. This has proven to be a success with the church children, however it has been a challenge to reach out to those outside of the church circles. Harry and I have been out visiting the families when it was possible and it was great to see young people in 3D again. All the Schools work unfortunately cannot go ahead due to the schools not being allowed visitors from outside. Hopefully this will change in the new year.

#### Youth

Both Wired (Youth Group) and Youth Fellowship (Discipleship group) couldn't meet in person so we have been successful in running Youth Fellowship on zoom. We have found some very creative ways to engage the young people and teach them the Bible on zoom. However, with the dynamic of Wired this could not be run. For most of September and October we managed to get permission to run Wired under covid guidelines with limits of 10 allowed in at a time and it was great to see young people coming back. Unfortunately we have had to close Wired again for the time being in lockdown 2. We do hope we will be able to do more mentoring in this time and engage 1:1 as is possible within the new guidelines. A BIG THANKYOU to the team who has helped this happen, especially Tony and Jenny Merriman for your mentoring and support at this time.

## **Alpha and Talking Jesus**

As you will know I am doing a degree in theology and mission which the church has kindly released me for my development for 8 hours a week. One of the modules was on evangelism and mission, and the assignment was to do a project and write a reflection on it. At the same time Mark and I were talking about running an Alpha Course online. He phoned up a few hours after the conversation not knowing I had to do a assignment on this, to say, would I be up for heading this up and leading it. Due to the lockdown at the time I was struggling to fill my hours so this was a

great opportunity. We had an average attendance of 15 although we had over 20 sign up. Harry had just finished an Alpha Course so he joined me as co-host and we had a great time on zoom running this course and seeing people growing in their faith and really grasping some of the message of Jesus. God taught me a lot through it and I really learned to rely on him a little bit more rather than my confidence in technology. We have now continued with a few of them and are running a talking Jesus course on how we can share this with others. We plan on running another **Alpha Course STARTING 2nd February 2021**.




### **DECEMBER/CHRISTMAS NEWS**


