Can we pray for our church and community that the Spirit of God may move here in renewing power.

Free Subscription!

Most of you will by now realise that we are streaming our services through our own YouTube channel (IMC Livestream). This has brought a number of advantages:

you can still "attend" the service without physically coming to church; you can still "attend" church even if you are not available when the service is live;

it is a very low risk way of seekers experiencing our services; it allows you to revisit a service/song/sermon after the event; it also provides us with a platform to deliver other video messages

Not very easy to remember or tell to someone new, I think you'll agree!! Now, we can get what is known as a "custom channel URL" which would take the form of www.youtube.com/ourcustomchannelname where our custom channel name would be something like IMC_Live_Stream (i.e. something that is easy to remember). To get such a URL allocated to us we have to meet a list of criteria. The good news is that we have already taken action to meet all these criteria except one. The outstanding one is that we need to have more than 100 "subscribers" — currently we have 72. I would therefore encourage you to subscribe to our channel (if you haven't done so already). This may, of course, raise some questions in your mind if you are not used to this concept:

How do I subscribe? You simply click on the button that you will see when you visit our channel

What does subscribing mean, will it cost me any money? Subscribing only means that when we post a new video you will be notified via your subscriptions feed. It will NOT cost you any money.

So, if you could subscribe to our channel, then you'll not only be amongst the first to know when we post new videos, you'll also be helping to promote the ministry of IMC, and **it won't cost you a penny!** If you have any further questions, please don't hesitate to contact me.

Love in Deed and Truth

Thank you for your prayers for the village church in Cambodia that I wrote about in the April newsletter.

Stringent lockdowns in response to the Covid-19 outbreak that started in February have prevented the church from reopening in any form, either centrally or in homes. However, the Lord has provided an opportunity to show the love of Jesus to some needy families in the village.

The closure of markets, strict lockdowns of people who have been in contact with those who have tested positive and the inability of factory workers to go to work has resulted in some severe hardship.

A member of the church (Phearun, the young man about whose 'Cambodia for Christ' sports ministry I have written previously), although locked down in his home, has taken the initiative to organise a distribution of food to 50 families in the village and the Lord has provided Cambodian Communities out of Crisis with funds that we have been able to send to Phearun and another church member to contribute to this project. Each family has received rice, noodles, canned fish, eggs, salt, sugar, cooking oil and sauces, garlic, fruit and soap.


