Dear Readers

When Reg asked if one of the other members of the Leadership Team would be prepared to write a short piece for the magazine at our recent meeting, there was a bit of a tumbleweed moment. None of us leapt forward, we put forward various and valid reasons why we could not do it ranging from lack of time, to very poorly relatives to care for, feeling inadequate and having nothing special to offer.

After the meeting, I felt that quiet nudging that God does to us when He wants us to do something outside of our comfort zone and we resist, which led me to do some reflecting, and although I offer no great theology, I felt I should pen an offering.

I've been reflecting a good deal on the church and how things have been over the last 16 months and goodness me, hasn't the last year thrown up some challenges for us all? Something that came to mind was a meeting I once attended, at a previous church which had become rather heated. The source of disagreement was around the choir robes and tradition. After listening to the "debate" for some time, I felt prompted to ask the following question " If our church burnt down and everything material was destroyed (including the robes) what would happen? Would the church in that place cease to exist? Would we cease to worship together? Would we stop trying to reach out to those who don't know the love of our Lord? Is the church the building, or the people, and what is the church's purpose? In response, the meeting went rather quiet!

In some ways, the Covid Pandemic could be seen as a sort of 'fire' equivalent. It forced us out of the building and to find new ways of doing things, and to make changes at a previously unheard of pace. The church didn't cease to exist, we did find new ways to worship together, and I think for many, it has given a deeper appreciation of our church family. For some of us, being able to continue to meet for services and house groups and via Zoom has been a life-line. Our house group has been really blessed and we have all found strength and support through prayer and fellowship as we continued to meet virtually each week. As we move forward, it would be very easy to slip back into doing things as we have always done them, but maybe God wants us to seize this opportunity for a fresh start. As I walk down to church on a Sunday, I often think about the people I see out and about for whom the thought of going to church on a Sunday morning would not cross their mind. How would they feel if they were to walk into a service one Sunday? What would they see that would make them want to come in to find out more? For many, it would be a completely alien environment; much of the language used for example could sound like jargon. One thing Covid has taught is that church is not just for Sundays, church is not the building, and with that, it is not just for its existing members. God wants us to be outward looking, and the challenge for us is how to do this.

Let our prayer be for God to show each one of us; no matter how ill-equipped or inadequate we may feel in our own strength, what His plans for the way forward are, and what role each of us has to play.

This voluntary position is dependent on suitable references, and a DBS check will be required.



BOOK REVIEW

'Finding the Peacemakers' by Dan Morrice

Dan Morrice, is a Christian geography teacher and a travel writer from Bristol. He has recently published his first book with Hodder and Stoughton based on his encounters and experiences amongst Christians who he calls 'the Peacemakers'.



The book starts by him travelling to Chile to find out more about the miraculous survival and rescue of thirty three miners after they had been trapped in a collapsed mine for 69 days. His investigations and interviews led him to the conclusion that they were not just survivors but also 'peacemakers'. This was because their endurance and survival had much to do with the attitude they took to each other, encouraged by the spiritual guidance and leadership of one of the miners who was a believer, those people praying for them outside the mine and also the tangible presence of 'miner number 34'.

Further true stories involve Syrian refugees, ex-football hooligans in the UK and revolutionaries in Israel-Palestine. As it states on the dust jacket 'Dan discovers how the most unlikely people are discovering Christian faith and rewriting the fractured history of our time.'

He has a particular heart for the marginalised and the refugee and so, linking the fact that Jesus was a refugee, Dan took time out and embarked on a personal trek of 500 miles across the Negev Desert to find the source of hope first hand.

I was initially encouraged to read Dan's book by my friend who is Dan's mother so I picked it up for her sake in the first instance. However, I was so glad I did as I found it a truly inspirational read – in fact I read it in one day! I have taken on board afresh the message that with Jesus we can expect miracles and the ability, through his intervention in our lives, to 'rewrite the narrative'.

Our Youth Worker Internship : Harry

It has been an awesome year working with Harry, it has certainly stretched me as a person but I believe it has also been an awesome opportunity for Harry. In the past few weeks we have been working on our presentation styles and watching back recordings of ourselves trying to work at becoming the best youth workers we can be. As Harry moves on I would like to thank him and you for the opportunity and your investment in future youth work. It has been awesome. I know God has some very exciting plans for Harry and I can't wait to see how God is going to use him.

Kids

It was so exciting to finally come back to church with **Kingdom Kids** and **The Big Start** on 16th May. We realised how much we missed their presence in the church and how lovely it is to do kids work in real life. Although zoom has been a lot of fun, in person is so much better. We have seen a good number back and hope to keep growing the Sunday kids groups by running a few **Fun Day Fridays** in the summer to attract families back but also connect with new families. So watch this space!

Youth

It has been fantastic to also bring back **Wired Youth Club** and **Youth Fellowship** our discipleship group. We have seen a great uptake to these and have really enjoyed going though our series of questions e.g. Do we have a freewill? Where did God come from? Is there even a God. But we have had some great

opportunities, one of which was a conversation about a zombie apocalypse and if one of our young people was in one they would throw a granny at the zombies and run (sorry granny's). So I asked how old would the granny have to be to be expendable? Leading to a conversation about where we get our ethics from and how do we decide, where we could testify about where we as Christians get our ethics and standards from.

Alpha and Housegroup

We have finished our last **Adult Alpha** which has led to quite a few more signing up to our online housegroup. Which is always encouraging. We have been going through the fruits of the Spirit but we are also doing a **Big Question night** talking about questions like, how seriously should I take the Bible, would a God of love send people to hell etc. It has been great to discuss some of the topics our members are interested in.

We are planning to run a **Youth Alpha** in the next few weeks as we have had some great interest in faith from the Bridge Project and other areas. So again watch this space and if you have young people interested please do contact me.

What next for Phil?

Around 5 years ago we felt God calling us to buy a house in Barne Barton in Plymouth, where we had previously said we would never move. In the past 5 years we have been working as a director of Pioneers Project CIC (finds us on facebook) in our spare time with their community work, running a community cafe, redeveloping Ballpoint Barracks and generally talking Jesus with people who were open to it. We have applied for funding to both be community chaplains. We would like to see an active church plant on the estate in the next 5-10 years. We are having conversations with the Methodist church and we are praying that God will clearly guide and lead our steps. So we do value your prayers. At present there is no guarantee of funding but, we are trusting God to provide our every need. Please do pray that God will guide us in the next few steps. We are looking to kick off an Alpha Course in September and we have around 5-10 possibles already, so it is really exciting.
