

#### SEPTMEBER NEWS





Work for the next 3 years. Well done **Immogen**- not an easy time to be doing A levels!!



I just laughed. But I'm not laughing now, mum. That precious conscience you saddled me with is making more and more noise in my head, the older I get. And the sparkle has gone from the eyes of my darling Leah. And I don't know what to do.....

Hiding like this isn't exactly a plan, although it feels oddly like one. And another thing: how did I actually get up here? Considering my present shape, that's a bit of a mystery in itself, you have to admit. But I do remember how urgent it felt: I was a man on a mission!

Perhaps I'm going crazy? That's entirely possible. Been going crazy for a good while. They'll find me one day, wandering in the woods, with leaves in my hair, talking to the birds, and they'll wink at one another. "Told you", they'll say, " he isn't quite right in the head."

So. I got up into this tree without planning to, and now I'm scrambling down again, grinning like the idiot I am. Getting down, simply because He came and looked up at me, with his kind eyes and his own great grin, and invited himself to tea.

And that's the answer! Whatever the question was, that I've been asking myself all these years, here's the answer to it: He's coming to tea! In fact, we are going to have a party, and all my friends will come, and dear Leah will bustle happily about, just like she used to.........

Because suddenly, it's all totally straight forward. I was lost, obviously, and He found me. He knew where I was and came looking for me.

That's He with a capital H, by the way.

This was a testimony I gave out at church during the summer. It encouraged me to be a part of this situation and I shared it at church in the hope that it would encouraged others. Chris Reed, who saw my testimony on YouTube, suggested I write it down so that it can be shared by anyone who had been unable to access the service online. So here goes.....

Many people might not know that I work as Physio Assistant at a hospital. The patients that I work with are mainly elderly people who are recovering from a period of ill health or have recently suffered a fall. Part of my job is to help them regain their confidence and rehab them back to their previous levels of living or as close as we can get it. The previous week I had had a patient who had been very unwell in Derriford and had not been out of bed for a few weeks and their body was very de-conditioned. recorded a conversation between the doctor and the patient saying that the patient's heart was not strong anymore and if it stopped the staff many not be able to start it again. The patient had said that she was ready to die and ready to go and meet God. Following this conversation, she was sent to the hospital where I work for rehab. During the first session she struggled to sit to the side of the bed unsupported. She required help from two members of staff for everything. Another thing you should know is that I work alongside a Band 6 Physiotherapist who is very knowledgeable and, to be honest, I am a little intimidated by this person. We were both working with the patient one day and we had managed to support that patient to sit and we were using all sorts of aids to help them to stand and not getting very far. The patient was tired and had made very little progress. Following the lead of the physiotherapist we had tried everything and nothing was working. The patient kept saying that she was a Christian and that she was ready to die, she had given up and I know from previous experience, that giving up is quite often the end for some of our patients. If the patient has chosen to really give up there is often not much we can do. From out of nowhere, I remembered the verse Philippians 4:13 which says "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me". Now I don't see or feel God everywhere like some people. I don't know if I should admit that, but most of the time I find it really hard to hear what he is saying, apart from picking songs for church. He is usually quite clear about that. However, I heard this verse clearly in my head and realised that this verse was not for me, it was for the patient. Despite being a bit nervous about quoting this verse in front of the physio I shared the verse with the patient and she brightened up and she just stood.

It wasn't even very difficult for her, she used the aid, but compared to how she was presenting before it looked like a completely different patient. The patient was so happy and said that this was exactly what she needed to hear. The strength of God flowed through this woman and gave her physical strength for about half an hour and enabled us to have a really good physio session with her where we could get her muscles active and engaging again. This was an amazing miracle to have observed. I felt like I was in Bible times and had seen a sick person being healed by the Word of God. I went home on a high.

The following day, I arrived at work to find this patient couldn't remember what I had said, but remembered I had said something that had given her the strength to stand and she had told all the nurses. The nurses were all waiting for me so they could ask me what I had said. They all knew I was about to go on annual leave and according to them, I was the only person who could help her to stand. All the nurses wanted to know what I had said to the patient so I quoted the scripture to them. They said they didn't really understand why it worked, but accepted that this motivated the patient and asked me to write it down for them. I wrote it down 8 times for different nurses. By the end of the day I had heard a couple of the nurses saying this to the patient to help her stand and it worked every time. Other patients on the ward were seeing it as well as all the staff. It was truly amazing, I couldn't believe it.

Part of the sermon on Sunday was about listening out for God when he is speaking so this testimony went perfectly with the message. It's so exciting to see the power of God working and when we see these miracles we should be sharing them with each other. The world around us feels dark and hopeless at times, but this felt like a shining lighthouse that couldn't be ignored. It was so obvious, God was saying I am doing this, can you see it? And thankfully, I could and it was a source of great encouragement and hope that had encouraged me and I felt I should share when given the opportunity which arrived at church the following Sunday. Please be encouraged by this testimony and look out for times when God is speaking to you, the results can be fantastic.

#### **Dear Friends at Ivybridge Methodist Church**

Thank you so much for your kind gift to strengthen our persecuted church family around the world who are risking it all to follow Jesus. Thanks to your prayers and support, our brothers and sisters know they are not alone and can stand strong in their faith.

In May 2019, Athit\* and his wife Boupha\*, who have three children, obeyed God's calling to lead a church in a village. They witnessed many miracles and, before long, between 200 and 300 people were regularly attending services. But it angered the local authorities, who eventually imprisoned Athit. Over a year later, after paying a hefty fine, Athit was released.

During this time, you provided food and other practical help for the family, including Athit (the prison does not provide food for inmates). You also enabled Boupha to receive counselling. "I'm very grateful for the support you've provided for us," shares Boupha, who had to lead the church in Athit's absence. "You have been with us throughout this journey. Your support is overwhelming, and my heart is leaping with joy."

May the Lord fill you with His Spirit and surround you with His love.
