

Dear Friends,

The story is told of a man called Yates who, during the depression, owned a sheep ranch in Texas. He did not have enough money to pay the mortgage and so was forced, like many others, to



live on government help. Each day as he tended his sheep, he worried about how he was going to pay his bills. One day, a seismographic crew arrived on his land and said there might be oil and sought permission to test. At 1115 feet a huge oil reserve was struck. Mr Yates found, to his surprise, that he owned the oil and the mineral rights. He had been living on benefits and yet he was a millionaire. Think of it - he owned all that oil with its tremendous potential, yet for many years he did not realise it.

How often are we like Mr.Yates? Considering ourselves poor and helpless, yet all the while unaware of the extraordinary power that we have available to us. What do I mean? Well, for we have just entered the Pentecost season, one that will take us over the Summer and into Autumn. It is a time of renewal for Christian believers, with a focus on the empowerment from the Holy Spirit, leading to a deeper intimacy with God. But so many of us remain unaware of the extraordinary power of God

available to us, with all His incredible potential, for us and our community. 
