From Amanda...

Do you remember the game 'Follow my leader'? It was an easy game to play, with one child chosen to be the leader and the others had to get in line behind and follow his or her actions. Young children love it and are eager to volunteer to be part of the game. But at a past youth club, when playing with older children, we used to put a blindfold on those who were going to follow the leader – and that made all the difference! What would have been an easy game, just following the leader as they jumped or hopped or clapped, often became a much trickier exercise. What if they bumped into a chair or a door and hurt themselves? We certainly didn't want that and so we came up with an idea - we got a piece of rope, and gave it to the leader to hold and then passed it along the line so each of the followers held onto the rope as well. As long as they kept holding on to the rope, they found they could safely follow the leader.

That reminds me of one day, when Jesus was walking along the road with some of his disciples, someone said to him, 'I will follow you wherever you go.' Jesus replied, 'Foxes have holes to live in, and birds have nests, but the Son of Man doesn't even have a place to lay his head.'

It isn't always easy to follow Jesus. Sometimes we are like the children who played 'follow my leader', who raise our hands and say, 'I will follow you wherever you go' without even knowing what we are going to be called to do. We may find that we are like the children who are wearing blindfolds - it isn't easy to follow the leader when we can't see the way.

So what can we do? Well, Jesus is holding out His hand.

Just like those children who held onto the rope in order to move safely around and enjoy the game, sometimes we need something or *someone* to hold onto. Let me encourage you to hold onto Jesus. He will guide you through the difficult days of your life, and He won't let you fall and hurt yourself, as long as you are holding on. That goes for us as a church as well. Sometimes we lose sight of Jesus and lose our grip, and attempt to hold onto other things instead, like traditions and buildings, but remember we follow a leader who didn't even have a place to lay His head.

There is a song I like called, "Hold on to Jesus" by Erin O'Donnell, that says it like this:

I wish I could protect you from the worries of this life. but if there's one thing I could tell it's no matter what you do hold to Jesus, He's holding onto you.


