
Sunday 25th September—Harvest Songs of Praise

Proceed Eastbound along the A38 to the turning for Ashburton.

Pear Tree. B3352 Take the exit.

Turn right towards Ashburton.

Turn right again at the Shell garage, signposted Buckland in the Moor.

Drive into Ashburton town and take the left turn for Widecombe and Buckland.

Bear left over the river and follow signs for Buckland in the Moor.

After approx 2 miles, turn right, signposted Haytor and

Widecombe (this sign is partially obscured by foliage)

After approx 1.5 miles, cross a cattle grid and a small copse. Park near here on the grass verge.
