"Before the hills in order stood, or earth received her frame, from everlasting thou art God, to endless years the same"


Our voices rang out across the hills and tors as we lustily sang the hymn, and we marvelled at the magnificent views; moorland, sea and sky.

Dear friends.


First, an apology. I'm sorry that this month's Newsletter is late. It's entirely my fault for not scheduling my commitments better. Secondly, a request.


