



#### Book Review

#### Red Moon Rising - by Pete Greig

I came across this book unexpectedly, following up a reference to another book in a recent 'Be Filled' service. One has limited access to content in the 'look inside' facility on Amazon, but I was intrigued to read in the foreword that:

"Red Moon Rising presents the raw power of a loving God and yet it also shows that there can still be pain in our everyday lives...... Our world is waiting for us to love and show God's heart through his powerful presence. As you read Red Moon Rising you'll be blessed and challenged to go into all the world and to let God shine in creative ways."

So I got the book.

The story begins on Cape St Vincent in south west Portugal where Pete Greig was hiking with a friend when he was given a vision of an army of young people arising in countries across Europe. What this vision meant and it's working out was to take some years but eventually resulted in the 24/7 prayer movement.

After travels across Europe Pete subsequently moved to Chichester where a lively and growing church with a focus on young people was established. Life was good with good friends and a young family. However after seven years, despite success in ministry including various invitations to speak internationally, he had a growing sense of restlessness and took off with his wife Sammy and their young son on an extended road trip around Europe. Various encounters were to affect him, from the joy of a visit to Herrnhut, the site of the Moravian church and their hundred years of continuous prayer, to the pain of driving through a Romanian border town and the clear sight of prostitution on the streets. Returning to England they decided to try an experiment on the Moravian model with a 24/7 prayer room. From this simple experiment the prayer rooms - and their approach to spirituality and culture, have spread virally into half the nations across the earth. It has been exciting to read of spiritually hard places where the power of God has demonstrably impacted the lives of the hurting and the lost. There is also a reminder that some mighty people of prayer clearly used by God have faced various difficulties and health challenges, like the rest of us.



I found the book fast paced, exciting and challenging to my attitude to prayer. A quote on the back cover says "Provocative, prophetic and powerful – proof, if you need it that God is on the move". I couldn't agree more.
